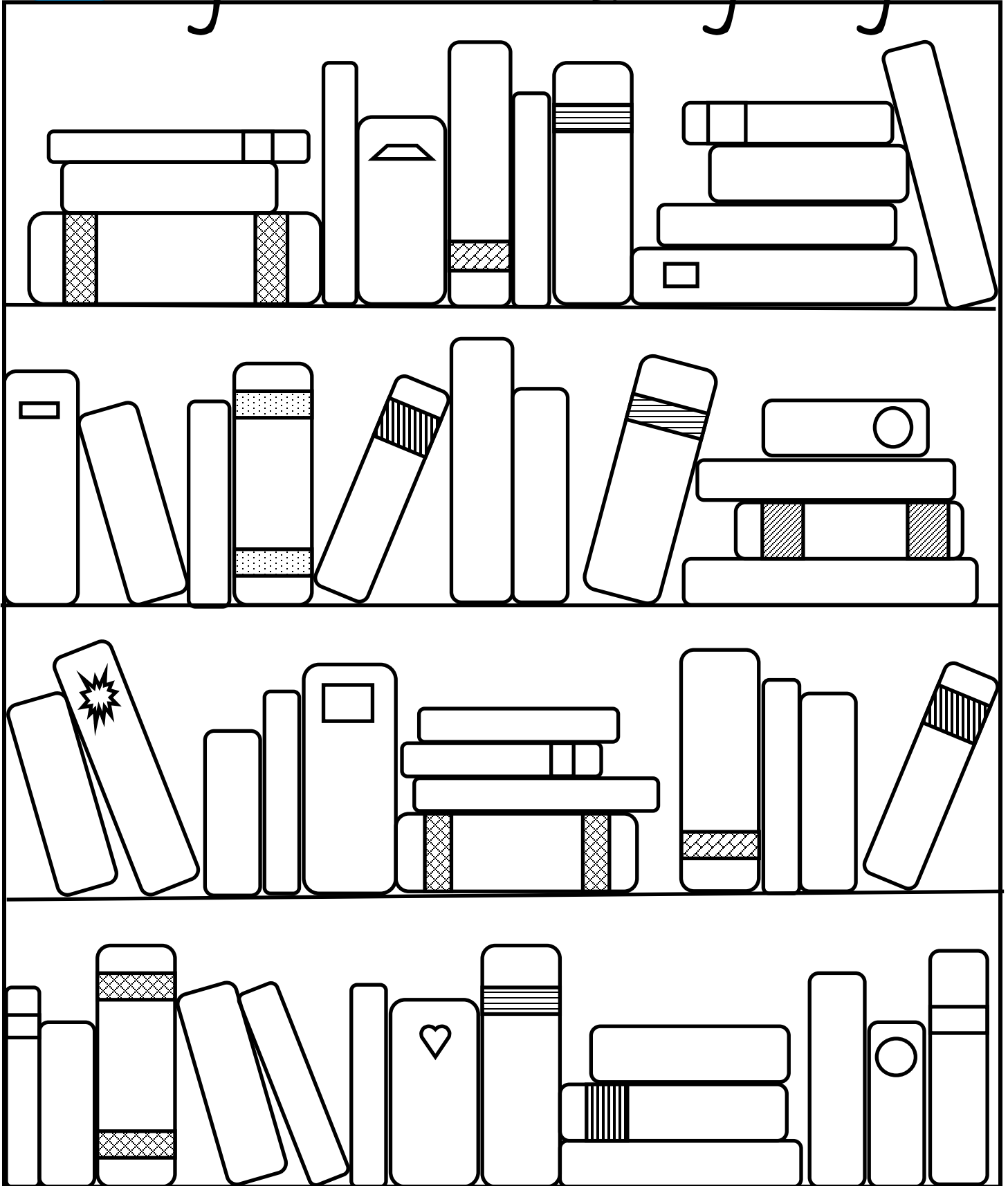




My 2021 Reading Log
